## Show & Tell

Greetings from Lois and Gwen! We are the new Show & Tell coordinators and we are committed to showing your quilts to their best advantage and hope that we have at least a dozen every month! We've worked on the display racks, practiced the putting-up and taking-down, and promise to have your photograph ready to be picked up the very next month after showing.

So here's what you do:

- Bring your quilt and the completed Show & Tell form to us at the Show & Tell table between 6:30 and 7:00 pm. (There's a form on page 8 of this newsletter, you can find it on the Web site <http://www.boisebasingquilters.org>, and we'll have one at the table.)
- When your quilt is shown, tell us something about it: Why did you make it? What technique(s) did you practice/learn in making the quilt? Name of the pattern, quilter's name, how long you've been working on it – Make it fun and interesting and about 1 – 2 minutes long.
- Stand by your quilt for a photograph, and then help take your quilt down, fold it and take it with you to your seat. (In the meantime, we'll be featuring the next quilt on the other side of the room.)
- The next month, pick up your photograph on the counter near refreshments – and tell your friends to check you out on the BBQ web site – quilt photos will be posted by month so they will be easy for you to find. Look under Activities, then Show & Tell and the month your quilt was shown.

## October Workshops Karen Kay Buckley

Mark your calendars now! Boise Basin Quilters will have an opportunity to learn from one of America's premier quilt makers when Karen Kay Buckley presents a lecture and brings two of her delightful designs to classes on October 16 – 18.

Karen Kay has been involved in quilting since 1982. She opened her own shop in Pennsylvania in 1986, where she taught students of all levels; and began developing her own designs and classes. After selling her business to accommodate her husband's career move, she had three books published by the American Quilter's Society: "From Basics To Binding: A Complete Guide To Making Quilts", "Above And Beyond Basics", and "Love To Quilt: Bears, Bears, Bears". She was a contributor to the Rodale Press book "The Ultimate Visual Guild". Her fourth book "Appliqué Basics: Flower Wreaths" was published in 2000. Karen Kay's newest book "Earthly Delights: The Perfect Finish" displays more than forty of her quilts and explains how she designs her elegantly designed quilt borders.

Karen Kay has thirteen magazines covers to her credit, including the fabulous quilt "Magical Medallions" in the September 2003 *Quilter's Newsletter* magazine. She was voted the 1997 Teacher of the Year by the *Professional Quilter* magazine.
