PLEASE READ THIS FORM CAREFULLY

Rules

1. Quilts displayed in previous BBQ shows are ineligible, except those entered in the "Ambiance" category [1700].
2. Quilts must be in excellent condition. They should be free of stains, pet hair, and odors.
3. Boise Basin Quilters' members may enter two items at no charge in categories 100-1600. Members may enter additional items with an exhibit fee of \$3.00 for each item after the first two.
The entry fee is \$10.00 per entry for a non-member.
BBQ member/non-members may enter as many entries as they wish, however no more than 2 entries per individual may be entered in any one judged category.
Quilts in the ambiance exhibit will not be counted, nor will there be any exhibit fee charged for these entries.
4. **Each entry must include:**
 - a. Completed and signed entry form: Either "Judged Entry Form" or the "Non-Judged Entry or Ambiance Quilt Form".
 - b. Entry fee, if applicable.
 - c. A **PHOTO** of the entry for identification/security purposes.
 - d. Completed entry form(s) and **PHOTO(s)** must be submitted on or before the **May Guild Meeting, Thursday, May 21, 2009**. Entries may be mailed to BBQ Quilt Show Entries; c/o Gail Wilson; P O Box 140506, Boise, ID 83714. **Mailed entries must be postmarked by Wednesday, May 20, 2009.**
 - e. If your entry is machine quilted, you must indicate if the quilting was done on a home sewing machine or a long-arm quilting machine and who actually executed the machine quilting. If your entry is hand quilted by another person, you must indicate who actually executed the hand quilting.
 - f. Design/Pattern source must be identified on the entry form.
 - g. **Judging is optional.** Two different entry forms are provided: one for Judged entries and another for Youth/Non-judged or Ambiance display. Entry fees are the same whether judged or not. (Ambiance – no charge, see #3 above)
 - h. Every effort will be made to judge all entries entered for judging. However, due to time constraints, the number of judged entries will be limited to the first 160 entries.
5. **Entries will be accepted:**
 - d. A **label** showing name, address, and phone number of the exhibitor SEWN to the back of the entry. (Lower left as seen from the back.)
 - e. **Saturday, June 13, 2009** at The Quilt Crossing, 5725 Fairview Avenue, Boise, ID, specific time and locations to be announced. Claim checks will be issued at that time.
 - f. At the BBQ guild meeting **Thursday, June 18, 2009**. Claim checks will be issued at that time.
 - g. Shipped, if received by June 13, 2009. Return shipping must be provided if the quilt will not be picked up in person on Sunday, June 28, 2009. Contact: BBQ Quilt Show Entries; c/o Gail Wilson; P O Box 140506, Boise, ID 83714 - (208) 853-8739; or e-mail glwilson6@msn.com to make arrangements.
6. **You must pick up your entry on Sunday, June 28, 2009, between 6 pm and 7 pm. The person picking up the entry must present the claim check identifying the entry.**
7. A list of entry categories follows. The Boise Basin Quilters' Quilt Show Committee and the judges reserve the right to move or reject an entry if it has not been placed in the appropriate category.

Categories

Placement in a category is at the discretion of the judges and the BBQ Quilt Show Committee. Categories may be combined or further subdivided for more appropriate judging. Judges generally prefer that you do not compete against yourself in a category, however no more than 2 quilts per individual may be entered in any one judged category.

Category Definitions

Judged/Non-judged

Entry form must be complete and signed. Entry form must include accurate measurements, cite design source/inspiration, and list techniques. All involved in the making, including professional quilting stitches, must be listed. Non-judged entries will be displayed with the judged entries and will be eligible for all awards excluding the judged category awards.

One Person: The quilt or entry is the work of one individual

Two Person Quilt: Quilts or entries created by two people. They may be hand or machine quilted. This category includes any quilt that two people worked on in the construction or finishing in any way. This includes quilting done for hire.

Wall: Works designed primarily as wall hangings. Size will also be considered in placing in this category.

Bed: Quilts constructed for use as bed coverings or throws.

Art: One person, original design, any technique, or combination of techniques or materials used in a non-traditional way.

Appliqué: Appliqué predominates over piecing or other technique in either amount or effect.

Group Quilts – Any technique made by three or more persons.

Pieced: Piecing predominates over appliqué or other technique in either amount or effect.

Mixed: A combination of techniques including appliqué, pieced, embroidery, trapunto, cathedral windows, or yo-yo.

Wearables and Accessories/Fashion and Home: Items constructed with techniques associated with quilting, (such as piecing, quilting, surface embellishment, appliqué, embroidery, etc.) as a dominant design feature. This category would include garments, fashion accessories, and home accessories.

Youth: This category is to encourage individuals or groups of quilters, age 17 and younger to make quilts and enter them in the Boise Basin Quilters' Show. The quilt must be created entirely by the youth entrant.

Ambiance: Large quilts that will hang above the show room to provide atmosphere for the show. These quilts will not be judged or be eligible for awards. They may have been shown previously.

Awards

Judged Category Awards

- ❖ Judges' choice – Ribbons
- ❖ Best in Show – \$100 or gift certificate
- ❖ 1st Place in each judged category – \$50-100 cash or gift certificate
- ❖ 2nd and 3rd place in each judged category – Ribbons
- ❖ Honorable Mention recognition – Ribbons will also be awarded as determined by the judges
- ❖ Best Use of Color – Gift
- ❖ Best Machine Quilting – \$100 or gift certificate
- ❖ Nita Sale Award (excellence in traditional Hand Quilting) – \$100

All Entries except Ambiance are eligible for the following awards:

- Governor's Award – Gift
- Mayor's Award – Gift
- Youth Award - Gift
- Camille Morris Award (best use of plaids and stripes) – \$100 cash
- Innovative Surface Design Award – Gift certificate
