PLEASE READ THIS FORM CAREFULLY

Rules

1. A quilt shall be composed of three layers: a top, batting (filler) and backing and be hand or machine stitched together.
2. Quilts displayed in previous BBQ shows are ineligible, except those entered in the "Ambiance" category [1300].
3. Quilts must be in excellent condition. They should be free of stains, pet hair, and odors.
4. Boise Basin Quilters' members may enter two quilts at no charge in categories 100-1200. Members may enter additional quilts with an exhibit fee of \$3.00 for each quilt after the first two. The entry fee is \$10.00 per entry form for a non-member.

BBQ member/non-members may enter as many quilts as they wish; however no more than 2 quilts per individual may be entered in any one judged category.

Quilts in the ambiance exhibit will not be counted nor will there be any exhibit fee charged for these entries.

5. Each entry must include:

- a. Completed and signed entry form: Either "Judged Entry Form", "Non-Judged Entry Form" or "Ambiance Quilt Form".
- b. Entry fee, if applicable.
- c. A **PHOTO** of the quilt for identification and security purposes.
- d. Completed entry form(s) and **PHOTO(s)** must be submitted on or before the **May General Meeting, Thursday, May 20, 2010.**
- e. If your quilt is machine quilted, you must indicate if the quilting was done on a home sewing machine or a long arm quilting machine and who actually executed the machine quilting. If your quilt is hand quilted by another person, you must indicate who actually executed the hand quilting.
- f. **Design** or **Pattern** source must be identified on the entry form.
- g. **Judging is optional.** Three different entry forms are provided: one for Judged entries, one for Youth/Non-judged entries and one for Ambiance display. Entry fees are the same whether judged or not. (Ambiance – no charge, see #4 above.)
- h. Every effort will be made to judge all quilts entered for judging. However, due to time constraints, the number of judged entries will be limited to the first 160 quilts entered.

6. Quilts will be accepted:

- a. A **LABEL** showing name, address, and phone number of the exhibitor **SEWN** to the back of the quilt. (**Lower left as seen from the back.**)
- b. **Saturday, June 5, 2010** at The Quilt Crossing, 5725 Fairview Avenue, Boise, ID, from 10AM to 2PM. Claim checks will be mailed to entrants.
- c. At the BBQ guild meeting **Thursday, May 20, 2010.** Claim checks can be picked up at the Quilt Crossing on June 5th or mailed to the entrant.
- d. Shipped, to be received by **June 5, 2010.** Claim check to be mailed to entrant or other designated agent. Return shipping must be provided if the quilt will not be picked up in person on Sunday, **June 27, 2010.** Contact: BBQ Quilt Show Entries: c/o Gail Wilson, P O Box 140506, Boise, ID 83714-0506 - (208) 853-8739; or e-mail glwilson@msn.com to make arrangements.

7. You must pick up your quilt on Sunday, June 27, 2010, between 6 and 7 p.m. The person picking up the quilt must present the claim check identifying the quilt.

8. A list of entry categories follows. The Boise Basin Quilters' Quilt Show Committee and the judges reserve the right to move or reject an entry if it has not been placed in the appropriate category.

Categories

Placement in a category is at the discretion of the judges and the BBQ Quilt Show Committee. Categories may be combined or further subdivided for more appropriate judging. Judges generally prefer that you do not compete against yourself in a category, however no more than 2 quilts per individual may be entered in any one judged category.

Category Definitions

Judged/Non-judged

Entry form must be complete and signed. Entry form must include accurate measurements, cite design source or inspiration, and list techniques. All involved in the quilt making, including professional quilting stitches, must be listed. Non-judged entries will be displayed with the judged entries and will be eligible for all awards excluding the judged category awards.

One Person: The quilt or entry is the work of **one individual**.

Two Person Quilt: Quilts or entries created by two people. They may be hand or machine quilted. This category includes any quilt that two people worked on in the construction or finishing in any way. This includes quilting done for hire.

Wall: Works designed primarily as wall hangings. Size will also be considered in placing in this category.

- ❖ **Bed:** Camille Morris Award (best use of plaids and stripes) – Ribbon and gift certificate
- ❖ Innovative Surface Design Award – Ribbon and gift certificate

Quilts constructed for use as bed coverings or throws.

Art: One person, original design, any technique or combination of techniques or materials used in a non-traditional way **Appliqué:** Appliqué is predominate over piecing or other technique in either amount or effect.

Group Quilts – Any technique made by 3 or more persons.

Pieced: Piecing is predominate over appliqué or other techniques in either amount or effect.

Mixed: A combination of techniques including appliqué, pieced, embroidery, trapunto, cathedral windows or yo-yo.

Wearable Art and Accessories/Fashion and Home: Items constructed with techniques associated with quilting, (such as piecing, quilting, surface embellishment, appliqué, embroidery, etc.) as a dominant design feature. This category includes garments and fashion accessories with an emphasis on quilting, and home accessories.

Youth: This category is to encourage individuals or groups of quilters, age 17 and younger to make quilts and enter them in the Boise Basin Quilters' Show. **The quilt must be created entirely by the youth entrant.**

Ambiance: Large quilts that will hang above the show room to provide atmosphere for the show. These quilts will not be judged or be eligible for awards. They may have been shown previously.

- ❖ 2nd and 3rd Place in each judged category -- Ribbons
- ❖ Honorable Mention recognition – Ribbons will be awarded as determined by the judges
- ❖ Judges' Choice – Ribbons
- ❖ Best in Show – Ribbon and gift certificate
- ❖ Best Machine Quilting – Ribbon and gift certificate
- ❖ Nita Sale Award (excellence in traditional Hand Quilting) – Ribbon and gift certificate
- ❖ Isabelle Bowers Award – Ribbon and gift certificate
- ❖ Youth Award – Ribbon and gift certificate
- ❖ Camille Morris Award (best use of plaids and stripes) – Ribbon and gift certificate
