

Quilter and teacher Dianne Kane is coming to BBQ! Dianne has had a lifelong passion to be an artist. She was first introduced to quilting in 1998, and has since become a versatile designer and maker of original quilts. Visit her website at www.DianneKane.com to see a selection of her amazing quilts.

At the March guild meeting Dianne will present a trunk show entitled "Every Quilt Has A Story." The trunk show features quilts inspired by books she read, made during Dianne's memberships in Cover to Cover, Storytellers, Art Quilt Group, and Thread Tales. Print out the list and bring it to the meeting if you'd like to take notes during her presentation.

Round and Round and Round We Go

You'll learn to make kaleidoscope circles using a wedge ruler, and also learn how to create the inner circle. In this full-

day class you can design, cut, and assemble one circle. You may have time to get your piece quilted and bound as a stand-alone piece. For the class, pick a fun fabric with mirror images and be delighted with the surprise result (fabrics by Paula Nadelstern are suggested). You can also achieve very interesting results using two complementary colors; that's not the end of options...it could be fun to use stripes! See the posted supply list for samples of differing kinds of printed fabrics that would create interesting pieces, and additional finished pieces. Note: if you don't have a wedge ruler, one size will be available for purchase from Dianne on the class day.

April 29th: "Vintage 2-fer"

On April 29th, Schoolhouse will be offering not one, but two classes with a focus on vintage quilts and textiles. *A single \$15 registration fee will get you into both classes!*

9:00 am - 12:00 pm Quilting With Vintage Linens and Doilies

Get out those vintage linens and doilies, or start collecting some now! In this half-day class, Lois Alice will show examples of what she did with some of her grandmother's handwork, and will share lots of ideas for how to turn old doilies, table runners, or even handkerchiefs into a usable quilt (or curtain, tote, pincushion, or other object).

Bring your vintage pieces, along with possible things to sew on top of them for embellishment (e.g. buttons, lace, frilly yarn, seed beads) and dig out some fun possible backgrounds such as lamé, satin, or silk. You'll have a chance to experiment with possible layouts and pin your items to your background for stitching later . . . or bring your needles and thread or sewing machine and get started!

1:00 pm - 3:00 pm Repairing/Finishing Vintage Quilt Tops

Guild Vice-President Vicki Francis began specializing in repairing vintage quilt tops about six years ago and discovered how heartwarming these "rescues" can be and the miraculous transformations that can happen with the right set of skills, tools, and materials.

Join Vicki for an afternoon of sharing her knowledge. Here are some points she will address: Should we even try to rescue it? Should it be cleaned? How to clean without damaging it further. How to stablize fragile fabric before even considering quilting it. What types of quilting patterns work best and why? How to "interview" the quilt owners and create the provenance for future generations.

Feel free to bring a quilt top to the workshop for possible suggestions on how to handle repairs. However, time is a consideration so not all tops may be discussed. There are opportunities to take home a bin of fabric to make quilt top piecing kits, cut batting and backing to bundle with completed tops, to sew labels onto completed quilts, or to deliver quilts to recipient organizations. BBQ is pleased to support the City Stitchers, a 4-H sewing club led by Celia Roberts. They have scheduled a service project sew day on March 11. The club members will be making pillow cases and kids quilts using donated fabric from BBQ. A classroom has been reserved at the Ada County Extension. Sewing time is from 9:30 am - Noon, pizza lunch, and then they have a guest teacher coming to present a fashion workshop from 1:00 - 2:30 p.m.

Celia is planning on a good turn out of possibly 15 youth. Projects are beginner-level. The average attention span is about 2 - 2 ½ hours. This is enough time to complete a lap size quilt top with two kids working together or about 3 or 4 pillowcases each. Celia might need some adult quilters to come help with the event. BBQ members have supported 4-H events like this in the past. If you are interested, contact Celia Roberts for details.

There is no such thing as too many volunteers! If Quilts for Kids is a committee that you would like to volunteer time and energy to, please visit the table at our next membership meeting and let them know you are interested. There is room for everyone and the more hands the better!






Have you seen our phenomenal 2023 Raffle Quilt? Its construction was spearheaded by the Stitchin' Sisters of Nampa. The group meets on the 1st and 3rd Fridays of each month (holiday exceptions will be posted) at Faith Lutheran Church/TVCC on Montana Ave in Caldwell from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Meeting reminders are posted 5-7 days in advance on their Facebook page, Stitchin' Sisters of Nampa and an email is sent to members that prefer it. Often the group sews quilts for children in foster care in Canyon County, but members also work on their own personal projects. Every meeting includes "Show & Tell" and an opportunity to share. Occasionally a technique will be shared or offered as an informal "class." Bring a lunch and stay the whole day or come for as long as you wish. 


