How to Make a Pillowcase Using the Burrito Method

If you can sew a straight seam, then you can make a pillowcase with a French seam.

Step 1: Cut Out Fabric Pieces

Cut 1 piece - 27" x 42" (body of pillowcase)

Cut 1 piece - 9" X 42" (cuff)

Cut 1 piece - 2" X 42" (trim)

a. Step 2: Assembling the Pieces

Lay the Cuff out flat with the right side facing up.

- b. With the wrong sides together, fold the Trim piece in half lengthwise and press.
- c. Match the raw edges of the Trim along the top edge of the Cuff.
- d. Pin to keep the Trim from shifting.
- e. Place the Pillowcase Body on top of the Cuff/Trim with right sides together and pin.

Step 3: Why It's Called a Burrito

- a. Starting at the bottom of the Pillowcase Body, begin rolling the fabric towards the top edge.
- b. Continue to roll up the Pillowcase Body until it is a few inches from the top edge.
- c. Take the bottom edge of the Cuff fabric and wrap it over the rolled-up Pillowcase Fabric.
- d. Pin through all layers of fabric.
- e. Using a 3/8" seam allowance, sew along the raw edge.
- f. Fold back the Cuff and carefully pull out the Pillowcase Body.
- g. Keep pulling!
- h. Almost there!
- i. Press the Cuff and Trim on both sides.

Step 4: Side and Bottom Seams

- a. The next step uses a French seam.
- b. Fold Pillowcase in half wrong sides together, matching up the Cuff and Trim fabrics on the seam line.
- c. Pin around the raw edges on the side and bottom of the Pillowcase.
- d. Stitch together down the side and across the bottom using a 1/4" seam allowance.
- e. Be sure that the Cuff/Trim seam is even. I sew this first, then go back and do the rest.
- f. Turn the pillowcase.
- g. It's time to flip the Pillowcase wrong side out and press the seams down. Using something like a knitting needle or chopstick, push out the corners.
- h. Now, the Pillowcase is facing right sides together. Pin the side and bottom seams.
- i. Stitch the side and bottom seams using a $1/2^{"}$ seam allowance.

Step 5: Finishing the Pillowcase

- a. Turn the Pillowcase right side out and press the seams flat.
- b. You now have enclosed French seams, and the Pillowcase has no loose threads on the inside.
- c. Voila! A finished burrito pillowcase!

*A serger can be used to sew the seam side and bottom of the pillowcase in pace of French seams. If using a serger, sew the side and bottom seams with right sides together, serge seams and press.
