

In 2011-2012 when the website was new and struggling, Chair Maureen Stevens and Vice Chair Cheryl Neruda came up with new member benefits including free downloadable patterns along with creating the Schoolhouse program. Maureen took on the challenge of drafting patterns while Cheryl developed the Schoolhouse program.

The patterns were then named "Quilter's Runway" because a special place was reserved in the next Quilt Show to display quilts made with the patterns. Each year had a theme. It started with nine patterns that year with the theme "Runway Stars." It evolved into 12 patterns per year afterwards. A number of other guild members joined Maureen in providing patterns.

BOISE BASIN QUILTER'S GUILD

Deep down inside every human soul is the desire to create. It doesn't matter where we come from or what our abilities or interests are we each have inside of us an inherent desire to make something that didn't exist before. Why then, do so many of us shy away from or have a fear of that process? EVERYONE CAN BE CREATIVE. They just don't know where to start.

The two halves of our brains process information in two different ways. The left side of our brain works a lot like a computer. It translates sensory information in words, numbers and symbols and then processes it in a logical, orderly and sequential manner. It categorizes, organizes and analyzes and then stores the information in a communicable form: words. The right half of the brain isn't limited by words, logic or concern for time. Instead of using words, it processes the same information in glorious three-dimensional full-color, with surround sound, smell, taste and touch images.

To be truly creative we need to use both sides of our brain. The problem is that we have spent years training the left side to grow and gain information but we have neglected the right side. We have forgotten how to use the imagination, spontaneity, and intuitiveness we possessed as children. We need to RELEARN HOW TO PLAY. We exercise the left sides of our brains all the time. We need to try some Mental Jogging, do some creativity exercises to get the right sides of our brain in shape.

Judy Martin, in the October '83 issue of Quilter's Newsletter Magazine, once gave us four exercises to help get our creative juices flowing.

- 1. LOOK at pictures of quilts in books and magazines. Enjoy the shapes and colors and patterns. Do this often.
- 2. GO to quilt shows, quilt shops, and guild meetings. Drink in the quilts displayed and those shown. MEET with others and share your passion with your friends.
- 3. PLAY with your fabrics. Lay them out on the floor and play with different combinations of color and pattern and texture.
- 4. DOODLE. Start drawing on paper different designs. Judy says, "If nothing pops into your head, just draw something—anything."

These exercises may seem somewhat directionless, and they are, but in order to be creative, it's important to be able to let go of your usual organized way of thinking and rely instead on intuition. Remember, we all have inside of us the power and desire to be creative. Get busy and do some mental exercises. It will keep you young and just like physical exercise, the more you do it the better at it you will get.

We ask that you make two blocks each month, one for you to keep, and one to bring to the next Boise Basin Quilters Meeting to turn in.



Foundation Piecing with Freezer Paper

taught by Joyce Cambron on April 27th, 10:00-3:00



Joyce Cambron has been quilting for over 30 years, and was employed at both The Cotton Club and The Quilt Crossing. She first learned the freezer paper technique in a 3-day workshop with Judy Mathieson in 2002, making the large Mariner's Compass quilt shown here. In 2010, Leisure Arts published her book on

machine piecing curved seams, including 6 projects using her technique with freezer paper.

Joyce is eager to share this fun technique with you (and don't worry . . . the projects you'll be doing in class—shown at right— are very approachable!) You'll be introduced to the technique with the Off-Center Log Cabin Block and then move on to the Wonky House Block, where Joyce will discuss the challenges of odd-shaped fabric pieces and what's involved in sewing multiple sections into a block.

Do you have fat quarters that you've been saving for the perfect project? Schoolhouse is hosting a "Sit and Sew" this month with Kenna Ogg, a local quilt designer whose patterns are fat-quarter-friendly and often feature specialty rulers. Come and meet Kenna

and enjoy spending a day stitching with fellow guild members . . . with Kenna on hand to answer questions about the patterns and give cutting advice and color advice. Participants should bring one of the three Madison Cottage Design patterns shown here, along with basic sewing supplies and any required rulers and fabrics listed on the

back of the pattern:

- Field Greens (no ruler required)
- Cocoa Nibs
 (Creative Grids
 Perfect Rectangle
 Ruler)
- Eggplant Relish (Omnigrid R96)







All of Kenna's patterns are available from <u>sewfinity.com</u> a local online quilt store that lets you pick up orders at their location in Meridian. The patterns and rulers can also be found at other local quilt stores and online.

Please note that *in lieu of the usual \$15 Schoolhouse*registration fee, Kenna has requested that class participants bring \$15

Comfort Quilts that were turned in at the Feb. 15th guild meeting were delivered to nurses at Valor Health.

Comfort Quilts recently changed its name from Kids for Quilts to reflect the community base we serve.

The committee took in 40 completed quilts and 34 pieced tops ready for batting, backing and binding at our February 15 Guild membership meeting.

This week, we donated 15 quilts to Valor Health to their Assisted Living Dept, where they have a high population of patients who come into their facility without any family members to care for them so getting one of our handmade quilts "will not only be welcome but will be a treasured gift to many of our patients," said Kathy at Valor Health.

Comfort Quilts Committee is always looking for help by putting quilt top fabrics together, cutting batting and matching backing to the pieced tops, and distributing completed quilts. Reminder, we provide all the fabrics and battings!

SPECIAL PROJECTS

COMMITTEE MEMBERS: CHAIR: Kimberley Severns, Kathy England

The Special Projects committee is back up and running and has made a splash in making up kits for the taking.

We made up lots of chemo caps, pillowcases, Port-a-Pillow, and Christmas Stocking kits for distribution at our February membership meeting and your generous hands, took many of the items that night. We are so excited that you have missed us (thank you for your kind words) and that you are willing to help sew these items for our community.

At our February 15 membership guild night, we not only gave out but we took in several completed items, (10 chemo caps, 43 port-a-cath pillows and 7 pillowcases) from those who had picked up kits distributed in the past. Thank you so much for bringing them back!

This month we have donated to Valor Health (located in Emmett) by giving them 10 chemo caps, 10 pillowcases, 10 port-a-pillows as they are starting back up with chemo and infusion therapy to their local residents. Know that your busy hands will make such a difference in the lives of those who are going through traumatic events in their lives. We will be offering more to Valor Health as they get their chemo/infusion program up and running.

So let's talk Christmas Stockings! We have 140 men and women being deployed overseas this August and to show our support of the new deploys as well as serve the ones who are in Idaho, we have set a goal of making 300 Christmas stockings to donate to the Blue Star Moms Organization who fill and will mail overseas as well as personally hand out to organizations who cater to our Veteran population. We took in 25 completed stockings at the February meeting and distributed about 75 cut-out and ready-to-be-sewn stockings that night.

The Special Projects committee welcomes anyone interested in cutting out any of the above kits. We provide the fabric, velcro, ribbons, etc per project. 
