

In 2010, Leisure Arts published her book on machine piecing curved seams, including 6 projects using her technique with freezer paper.



BOISE BASIN QUILTER'S GUILD

Once, after listening to a stirring performance by a concert pianist, a woman told the performer that she would give five years of her life to be able to play like him. "I have given ALL of my life to play like I do," he replied.

How many times have you seen a beautiful quilt made by one of the master quilters and wished you could make one so beautiful? Have you ever stopped to consider how many years they have spent perfecting their craft? How many failed attempts or ugly quilts THEY made before the masterpiece came into being? Sometimes we either don't realize or don't take the time to find out the stories that each quilter has to offer about their work. It's the TIME thing. We want instant gratification with our own efforts. We want to be an expert quilter NOW. We don't want to learn the basics before we construct that complex and intriguing design.

One of the things I hated when I was a child was to practice the piano. I was always glad when my piano teacher slept through my lessons because she didn't notice how poorly I played my pieces. My children, too, hated to practice and sometimes it was a major battle to have them learn their pieces before they went to their lessons. Now that they are all grown, they are so glad that they kept up on their music studies, as it plays a big part in their lives. I can play some piano but if I had been more diligent, PRACTICED more, I would be a lot better than I am.

PRACTICE can be a dirty word, but it also can be the means of so much accomplishment. Heber J. Grant often quoted, "That which we persist in doing becomes easier for us to do; not that the nature of the thing itself is changed, but that our power to do is increased." If we want to improve our skills in quilting or anything else we have to be willing to put in the time to PRACTICE that which we want to learn. If you don't want to cut off the points on your stars or triangles, you need to PRACTICE until you get it right, even if in the process you might take out your seams three or four times! If your blocks never come out the right size, double check your cutting and your seam allowance. Measure and re-measure, sew and re-sew until it comes out right. Listen to criticism and adjust how you do things if need be. Your first quilt and even your fifth or sixth quilt will probably not be an award winning quilt but with PRACTICE eventually you just might come home from the Quilt Show with a blue ribbon.

So remember PRACTICE and PERSISTENCE will win in the end and being a little bit PICKEY won't hurt either.

Linda Schmidt of Short Attention Span Quilting Down and Dirty Design And Terrific Techniques



"Linda Schmidt started making her first quilt at the age of 8, and has made most of her own clothes since she was 12. She comes from a long line of quilting women and still uses some elements of traditional quilting, but most of her work involves art quilts, wearable art, portraits, and landscapes.

Linda has won over 300 ribbons and prizes at quilt shows and has taught; spoken; judged quilts; and exhibited nationally and internationally since 1990. She has had many of her quilts published in magazines and books, has taught online classes since 1993 for QuiltUniversity and The Academy of Quilting.com, and was chosen as Quilter of the Year by *Professional Quilter Magazine* in 2003.

She is also a four-time Fairfield and Bernina fashion designer, writer, and musician, and retired from her 26-year position at the City of Dublin (California) in 2017. She has three children, three guitars, three flutes, one piano, 5 million beads, one husband, a suddenly useful BA in French, and a five-bedroom house she cleans herself. She gardens, cooks, does Zumba three times a week, and writes good music and bad poetry in her spare time.

Linda's presentation and trunk show will cover principles of design you can keep in your head while creating traditional and/or art quilts and show you shortcuts and techniques to make your quilts come alive! You'll see how to use fabric paints, fusibles, heat guns, cracked ice, Lutradur, Tyvek, Angelina fiber, Puff Paint, foil, and many other substances to create special effects while remaining true to the quilting tradition."

HOW IT WORKS



Stuart Holderby is coming to our May membership meeting to hand sharpen scissors, knives while we hold our membership meeting.

He can sharpen:

- •scissors for sewing, including pinking and barber shears .
- •knives of all types kitchen, hunting, and leather this includes serrated.
- He does many other tools however those would require his shop equipment.

He can sharpen approximately 12 pair of scissors and 18 knives per hour.

- •Scissors pricing is \$7 per pair and \$9 for pinking shears.
- •Knives pricing is by length as follows. 0-6"= \$5.
- >6"-8"=\$7.
- >8"=\$9.

As far as to what he sharpens, almost anything that needs a cutting edge. Other than that listed above, it would need to be done in his shop such as mower, chainsaw, and circular saw blades, handsaws and clipper heads for barbers and animals. These would require a pick up by the owner in Emmett.

He will be at our church ready for business at 6:30 pm in the Fellowship Hall at the May 16th meeting.


RAFFLE QUILT IS A **COMMUNITY BUILDER-FOR YOU!**

You'll be introduced to the technique with the Off-Center Log Cabin Block and then move on to the Wonky House Block, where Joyce will discuss the challenges of odd-shaped fabric pieces and what's involved in sewing multiple sections into a block.



Kid For A Night Event Details:

The event includes a themed evening of games and activities, music, dancing, spectacular live & silent auctions and a delicious dinner. It's not your typical gala—we ask our attendees to come dressed up for the theme or in their favorite jeans and t-shirt.

Not only is Kid For A Night a wonderful opportunity to have a great time, the event makes a difference to the kids at St. Luke's Children's. Kid For A Night has raised more than \$11.5 million since its inception in 1992. This year, we ask our guests to time travel to their favorite decade and join us for a night at the Kid For A Night Time Warp!

This year's event will be hosted on Friday, June 7th at the Boise Centre.



Miracle Bear Project

Each year, we sell Miracle Bears, which are adorned in handmade costumes fit to our theme, for our event sponsors, community members and supporters to purchase. Each bear is \$100 and the donor has the opportunity to keep the bear or donate it back to the children's hospital for one of our patients to enjoy. As you would likely assume, the bears are almost always donated back to the hospital and it's

such a heartwarming experience getting to deliver them to the kiddos we care for. 100% of the funds raised from the event, including the miracle bear purchases, benefit the children's hospital directly!

To add a special touch, the bears all have hand crafted outfits that match our theme. Some are hand crocheted and some have handmade fabric costumes. Not all have to be super intricate so they can vary in terms of design.
