

# MARCH Featured Program Speaker



## MJ KINMAN

When people ask MJ Kinman what she does, she likes to tell them, "I make the biggest diamonds in the world . . . but instead of using the hardest substance on earth, I use the softest— cloth!"

MJ says, "The most beautiful gemstones capture light and reflect it back to us with unique brilliance, revealing their fiery personalities. Every gem has a story to tell...just like people.

This slide lecture and trunk show chronicle my own story – my 25+-year adventure learning how to create the world's biggest diamonds in cloth. Most importantly, though, the underlying message to my audiences throughout my presentation is the importance of choosing joy and saying "no" to fear, both in our creative lives and in our personal lives.

During my presentation, I'll discuss how I've learned to spot gemstones with personality – the unique configuration of light and color that translate into a successful work of art. I'll discuss my techniques to create and assemble the hundreds of pieces in each diamond, materials I use to create the wash of color and light across a gem's surface, and the quilting techniques that enhance a gem's facets. We may even talk a little bit (maybe a lot) about Kentucky Bourbon, as I describe the gem quilts in my series "Bourbon Diamonds"!

And as so often happens with any artist's decades-long journey, I'll share insights gleaned from my walk away from corporate life and into the creative life."

MJ has been featured in many of the world's top quilting magazines. Her work is included in collections as varied as Maker's Mark Distillery, the National Quilt Museum in Paducah, KY (where she has also taught workshops and had a solo show) and the International Quilt Museum in Lincoln, NE. We are honored to have her here in Boise!

# Improv Gem Workshop

MARCH 19, 2026

9:00-12:30PM



MJ Kinman, maker of giant gemstone quilts, will show you how to create sparkling gem blocks in a whole new way using the power of improvisational piecing.

Learn how to use improvisational strip-piecing techniques to create emerald-cut, baguette-cut, and Asscher-cut diamonds. These are diamonds that feature long, lovely facets – the “hall of mirrors” that highlight the interior clarity of a gem.

During class, MJ will discuss color selection for gems. (Hint: there is no wrong answer!). She’ll show you how to make your gem sparkle with value contrast, and how to make your gem glow with saturation contrast.

Finally, she’ll demonstrate simple assembly techniques and you will assemble the strip-pieced facets to create your own unique gemstone.

After introducing you to the four rules of color interaction, MJ Kinman will lead you on a deep-dive into the fourth rule – saturation contrast. Using fabric squares of different hues and saturation levels, you'll learn how to combine colors to create a glowing effect in your quilts, as though they were lit from within.

This class is an exploration of just one of the topics presented in MJ's new book "Crack the Color Code: Add Drama to Your Designs Using the Secrets Color Interaction." There is no sewing in this class.

# Playing with Pixels



MJ will share one of her favorite ways to find inspiration for new work or a new series – playing with images in a photo editing app. These apps allow you to manipulate images in infinite ways, transforming them into intriguing ideas for new work.

MJ will show specific examples of the process she has used to create new mock-ups of current and future work.

Additionally, students will learn more than 20 different ways to manipulate images to create fascinating designs. For example:

- Want to turn a ruby into an emerald? MJ will show you the tool to use.
- Boost the saturation of an image to make your image glow.
- Add a gentle curve or tight twist to your image.
- Pixelate your image into squares or triangles of different sizes.
- Slice your image into segments horizontally, vertically, or both.
- Create an infinite variety of kaleidoscopic images. (Caution: this is addictive!)
- Melt your image into waves of color.
- Tilt an image backwards, forwards, or side to side to add perspective.
- ...and more!

4-PATCH POSIE WITH DIANNE KANE



Are you ready for some surprises? Like a simplified form of stack-n-whack, this technique will create surprising new blocks, each with its own special design. It's as satisfying and addictive as eating a box of chocolates, because every block you make will automatically create four design options and you'll get to choose your favorite!

Because you'll be making 4-patches, the process will go pretty quickly, and it's likely that you'll get many of the blocks made during our sewing time. We'll also talk about how you can set and lay out the blocks: for example, with or without sashing or borders; on-point; with mitered strips on 2 sides; courthouse steps; and more. This is a technique that you'll want to use again and again – just because each block is a pleasant surprise!

# Upcoming Schoolhouse

## SEEKING SUNFLOWERS

Becky Kinzer, our 2026 Programs Chair, will be teaching an afternoon Schoolhouse class on March 14, 2026 from 1 pm to 5 pm. Becky will guide you through creating two sunflower blocks using patterns that she has put together herself. One of the blocks uses a traditional Bear Paw block to depict a sunflower. For the other block, Becky will speed up the construction process by showing you a quick method of creating eight half-square triangles at once!

If you'd like to donate your completed blocks to Wrap the World with Quilts for use in their current Ukraine Project, you may register for the class at no cost by emailing [Schoolhouse@boisebasinquilters.org](mailto:Schoolhouse@boisebasinquilters.org) and asking to be added to the class list. You will then be emailed the patterns so that you have time to cut out fabric as per the block instructions before coming to class. You may also choose to register for the class on our website for \$15 as usual, knowing that Becky plans to donate any teaching fees received to help support the Ukraine Project.

This class still has plenty of room, so feel free to encourage a friend (even a non-member friend!) to register with you! Note that the guild plans to provide some blue and yellow fabric, so feel free to participate even if you do not have fabric in those colors.





## HELP DESK


